## The German Grading System

In German universities, a 1 to 5 scale is used to evaluate study performances. Additionally, an ECTS grade can be added, especially in case of credit transfer. The following table will give you an overview of the grade distribution and its meaning.

German Mark	<u>Description</u>	ECTS Grade
1,0 – 1,5	Very good	A (best 10%)
1,7 – 2,5	Good	B (next 25%)
2,7 – 3,5	Satisfactory	C (next 30%)
3,7	Sufficient	D (next 25%)
4,0	Sufficient	E (next 10%)
4,3 – 5,0	Fail	F (Fail)
